World class facility set to open

Construction on the city's new Activity Center is nearing completion on the Municipal Center campus. Be on the lookout at www.CityofGooseCreek.com and on social media for a grand opening date for the impressive facility.

"The Activity Center will allow us to provide new and innovative programming in a state-of-the-art facility," Goose Creek Recreation Director T.J. Rostin said. "It will give us more flexibility with the scheduling of fitness classes, daily programs and activities, as well as the ability to add new programs to attract more children, adults and senior adults."

Rostin calls the facility a game changer for Goose Creek's growing gymnastics

program.

"This will enhance our youth gymnastics program tremendously," he said. "The added space will allow for more practice time, the ability to host state and regional meets, and will provide more gymnastics programs for recreational and competitive gymnasts."

"We envision a tremendous increase in our overall gymnastics participation numbers over the next five to 10 years. This facility will be second to none in the area which will entice more people to want to become a part of our program. With a little bit of luck, the next Olympic gymnast may develop his/her skills right here in Goose Creek!"

Habib to be sworn in as Goose Creek Mayor in May



Mayor-Elect Greg Habib will be sworn into office at 7 p.m. on May 3 at City Hall.

Goose Creek voters made history on Election Day this year by choosing a new Mayor for the first time since 1978.

Greg Habib was elected Mayor on Tuesday, April 3. Mayor-Elect Habib won a four-year term with 1,614 votes (51.04 percent) to incumbent Mayor Michael Heitzler's 1,544 votes (48.83 percent).

Mayor-Elect Greg Habib, who has held a City Council seat since 2016, will be sworn in on at 7 p.m. on Thursday, May 3 at City Hall. The Goose Creek Mayor serves a four-year term.

In the City Council election for three seats, the winners were Jerry Tekac with 1,741 votes (19.66 percent), Corey McClary with 1,690 votes (19.08 percent), and incumbent Debra Green-Fletcher, 1,546 votes (17.46 percent). Tekac, McClary and Green-Fletcher will also serve four-year terms on City Council term.

A total of 3,173 ballots were cast this year, representing 13.29 percent of Goose Creek's 23,875 registered voters. It was the city's largest vote turnout.

City says thank you to Mayor, Mayor Pro Tem



Tuesday, April 10 was a special night at City Hall.

At City Council's monthly meeting, South Carolina Representative and former Goose Creek City Council-member Joe Daning presented Mayor Michael Heitzler and Mayor Pro Tem Mark Phillips with framed S.C. House of Representatives Proclamations thanking them for their years of service to Goose Creek.

In addition, Mayor Pro Tem Phillips was given the Order of the Palmetto, which Rep. Daning presented on behalf of South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster. The award is the highest civilian honor given by the State of South Carolina.

Rep. Daning also presented both men with South Carolina State Flags that recently flew over the Statehouse in Columbia.

Mayor Heitzler served 10 terms as Goose Creek Mayor, from 1978 to 2018.

Mayor Pro Tem Phillips was first elected to City Council in 1986.

Special election set for July 31 to fill vacant Council seat

A special election to fill the Goose Creek City Council seat vacated by Greg Habib's election as Mayor will be held on Tuesday, July 31. Candidate filing for the seat opens at 12 noon on Friday, May 18, and will close at 12 noon on Tuesday, May 29.

Goose Creek's City Council elections

are non-partisan. Winners are determined by an at-large, city-wide vote. The winner of the special election will serve the remainder of that seat's council term, which continues until 2020. Voting on July 31 will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the Goose Creek Municipal Court at the Municipal Center.

Officers will check doors and windows for evidence of break-ins, vandalism or trespassing. Additionally, after the resident returns home, they will receive a letter from Chief Becker informing them of the number of times the house was checked.

Paperless billing a popular option for many residents

Many Goose Creek water customers prefer paperless water billing and an automatic debit option.

Signing up is easy.

Each month, an email will be sent from waterbill@cityofgoosecreek.com with "City of Goose Creek Utility Bill" as the subject. Complete the form found under "Online Payments" at www.cityofgoosecreek.com and submit it via email. As long as the authorization is received no later than the 15th of the month before your billing date, the next bill will be emailed.

Enrolling in a monthly automatic credit/debit card payment option is another easy way for residents to pay their bill. Residents may select the payment authorization to process on the 5th or 15th of each month.

Residents will continue to receive a monthly water bill with the amount that will be debited from a credit/debit card and it will indicate "paid by draft."

Recreation expands 'Pickleball' options in Goose Creek

Pickleball -- fun combination of tennis, ping-pong and badminton -- has proven to be a hit in Goose Creek. In fact, the Recreation Department recently increased Pickleball options for local players.

Indoor Pickleball courts are now available at the Goose Creek Community Center from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The court availability will return to three days a week on June 1, before the five-day-a-week availability resumes on Aug. 5.

The court fee for non-members has been reduced to \$2.

GCFD's Harris fills important new position

We've all seen them – usually while passing the scene of a car accident: the straight, “backboard” stretchers used to transport patients in and out of ambulances. At first glance, it's hard to imagine how this basic equipment could be improved.

It turns out that the stretchers do have an issue: their rigidity means that accident victims often try to adjust themselves, attempting to be more comfortable. In many cases, this movement causes additional harm.

A solution has come in the form of a new stretcher called a CombiCarrier. It's a two-piece, collapsible device that contours to the patient's body. This increases comfort, “and if they're comfortable,” GCFD EMS Battalion Chief Jared Harris explained, “they won't move around, and they'll do less damage.”

The stretcher, which is being used in Goose Creek, is one of many advancements made virtually every day in the field of Emergency Medical Services. Keeping up with these trends is one of Harris's responsibilities.

The Goose Creek Fire Department's EMS Battalion Chief is a newly-created position, and Harris – recently promoted from the rank of Captain – is the first to fill it.

The EMS Battalion Chief oversees the department's medical response operation.

In addition to personally responding to calls, Harris's duties include overseeing every firefighter's training, which is done in-house at the GCFD; ensuring ambulances remain DHEC compliant; keeping a close, daily check on the literally hundreds of life-saving drugs and medical devices used in the field; and, perhaps most importantly, closely monitoring every EMT and Paramedic.

“I make sure the morale stays up,” he said. “When you know that you are appreciated and needed, when you enjoy who you

work around, then you become better at your job.”

In Goose Creek, every firefighter is either an EMT or a Paramedic. That's not the case at all fire departments, and it creates more layers of expense and responsibility ... but it's a good thing for residents, and it's one of the benefits of living here.

Every Goose Creek fire truck is equipped with medical equipment and supplies. Harris often uses a Chevrolet Tahoe with the full complement of medical supplies. “If I'm closer to (an emergency call) than the ambulance or other units, I'll respond, and get their faster,” Harris said. “That's the goal.”

Around 10 percent of EMS calls each year constitute serious emergencies.

Joining the GCFD was a natural choice for Harris. “When I was young, my dad was a fireman,” he said. “I always had a passion for this profession.”

To increase the chances of fulfilling his lifelong goal of becoming a Chief, Harris earned a Bachelor's Degree in Fire Administration, and a Master's Degree in Organizational Leadership. He joined the GCFD in 2002.

Assistant Fire Chief Norm Cutshall calls Harris a natural leader. “When he sees a problem, he jumps into it,” Cutshall said. “I've supervised Jared since he became a Captain, and he just gets better and better at this job all the time. He's willing to ask questions, and he listens ... he does all the things a leader should do.”

There are no “off days” at a fire department, and Harris's workload is constant.

Yet he relishes the challenge.

His favorite part of the job? “I love the interaction with the citizens,” he said. “I meet lots of people with interesting stories, people I would never interact with if not for this profession.”

I am sure Coach Stacey Croston had no idea that her routine mammogram would end up the way it did. Most people go in for these exams praying that all is well. They go in with optimism, and a little bit of doubt, but never truly knowing. Well, our head coach at City of Goose Creek Gymnastics had the unfortunate news of breast cancer after her routine mammogram. I remember the look on her face when she shared her news with a few parents. She was obviously scared, but she had HOPE in her eyes. When you are in these types of situations HOPE, PRAYER and LOVE is necessary. I knew then that she would need to surround herself with the support of her friends, and the gym moms, but most of all her gymnasts who looked to her for guidance and encouragement.

Coach Stacey knew that she would have to be a ball of STRENGTH for these girls. She knew that her other coaches still needed her guidance to run that gym, and so she kept it moving. Even through her days after chemotherapy, she showed up to coach her gymnasts. She has not missed a gymnastics meet. She still leads the charge like a real trooper. Even through this journey, she continues to show more concern for others than herself. She continues to show kindness, and as a mom of a gymnast, there is no other attribute that is more important for a coach to show than kindness. I watched her day after day in her office preparing for the new gym, still smiling and showing excitement about what's to come. She is a true testament of COURAGE, RESILIENCE and STRENGTH. Cancer has nothing on our coach. It is these lessons that I want my daughter to learn from the woman she calls coach.


